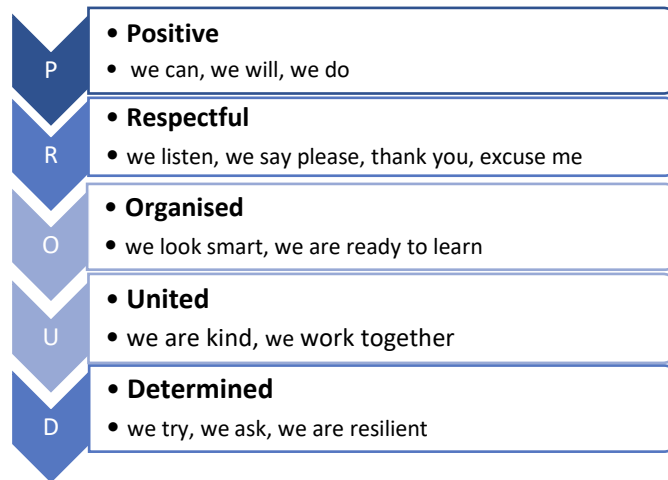




Fairfields Primary School Home School Agreement

<p>The Parents'/Carers' Responsibilities.</p> <p>I/We will ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • my/our child wears correct school uniform, has the appropriate equipment and kit for all lessons • my/our child attends school regularly and arrives on time • my/our child understands what acceptable and unacceptable behaviour in line with school policies • my child understands the PROUD values and I/we will support my/our child in keeping them • I/we inform the school of absences, work in partnership with the school and attendance service to solve any problems • leave of absence is sought well in advance and sanctioned by the school in accordance with school guidelines • I/we attend Parents' Consultations to discuss my/our child's progress • I/we discuss issues or concerns affecting my/our child at the earliest possible moment • I/we take note of and respond to all communications promptly and effectively • I/we actively support my/our child with homework, including daily reading • I/we take an active interest in my child's life at school • I/we conduct all communications with school staff and other adults politely and professionally. (All incidents of inappropriate conduct may be reported to the Governing Body) • I/we support the school approach to online safety and will not deliberately upload any images, video, sounds or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community 	<p>The School's Responsibilities to Pupils and Parents.</p> <p>The school will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • encourage and develop every child's motivation for learning • enhance self-esteem by valuing and acknowledging children's attempts and achievements • provide equality of opportunity and pupil support to enable pupils to access a broad, balanced curriculum through a <i>safe</i> and <i>positive</i> learning environment • clearly define the school Behaviour Policy and PROUD values outlining expectations of attitude and behaviour • provide clear information to parents through reports, newsletters and other written communication • deal with parental/carer concerns and complaints promptly and effectively • listen and respond promptly to pupils' concerns • provide appropriate information on the curriculum • provide opportunities for direct meetings with staff to discuss pupil progress and other issues • provide encouragement to pupils regarding progress through written reports and targets • provide guidance and support to all pupils through the pastoral care system • contact parents/carers at the earliest opportunity regarding concerns over their child's behaviour • conduct all communications with parents, carers and other adults politely and professionally • not deliberately upload any images, video, sounds or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community
