(All incidents of inappropriate conduct may be reported to the Governing Body). • I/we support the school approach to online safety and will not deliberately upload any images, video, sounds or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community 	<p>The School will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • encourage and develop every child's motivation for learning. • enhance self-esteem by valuing and acknowledging children's attempts and achievements. • provide equality of opportunity and pupil support to enable pupils to access a broad, balanced curriculum through a <i>safe</i> and <i>positive</i> learning environment • clearly define the school Behaviour Policy and Golden Rules outlining expectations of attitude and behaviour. • provide clear information to parents through reports, newsletters and other written communication. • deal with parental/carers concerns and complaints promptly and effectively. • listen and respond promptly to pupils' concerns. • provide appropriate information on the curriculum. • provide opportunities for direct meetings with staff to discuss pupil progress and other issues. • provide encouragement to pupils regarding progress through written reports and targets. • provide guidance and support to all pupils through the pastoral care system. • contact parents/carers at the earliest opportunity regarding concerns over their child's or behaviour. • conduct all communications with parents, carers and other adults politely and professionally. • not deliberately upload any images, video, sounds or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community
