- Read a book chosen by your teacher

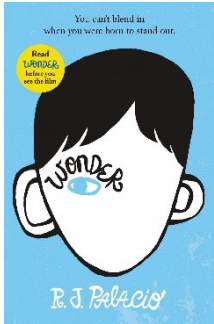
5 Point Challenge:

- Read a book from the 'Classics' list

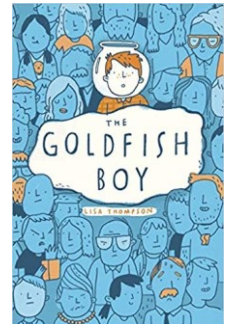
