## Nursery Admissions Policy

### 1. Information

Nursery applications for September 2026 school year are open for children born between 1st September 2022 and 31st August 2023.

All children are entitled to 15 hours free early education (15 hours FEE) from the term after their 3rd birthday. We offer the statutory 15 hours of free early education (FEE) over five days with children being offered either:

- five mornings - 8:45am – 11:45am
- five afternoons - 12:15pm – 3:15pm

**Parents must take up the full 15-hour free provision unless a temporary reduced timetable is agreed as part of an extended transition.**

Additionally, we have spaces for 30-hour sessions with the additional hours spread over 2 classes:

- Morning Nursery Session hours: 8:45am – 3:15pm
- Afternoon Nursery Session hours: 8:45am – 3:15pm

The timings for the 30-hour day are dependent on the Nursery session allocated but will operate from 8:45am-3:15pm each day.

The 30-hour provision can be funded through the government funded 30-hour childcare scheme, or alternatively parents/carers can pay for the additional provision at a cost of £75 per week (we do ask that you commit to a full term at time)

Applications close Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March 2026, places will be offered from the week commencing 16<sup>th</sup> March 2026 with parents/carers having one week to accept the offer.

We reserve the right to withdraw an allocation if a child is not able to start in September.

### New from September 2025 – Rising 3-year-old spaces – places

We now offer 15-hour spaces for rising 3-year-olds for children born between 1st September 2023 and 31st March 2024, who qualify for 15 hours free early education from the term following their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday.

This provision is for mornings 8:45am – 11:45am

Applications will open in the September 2025 with places allocated by 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026

These places will be allocated under the same admission rules as the main Nursery spaces; however, they will have automatic admission to our main Nursery in the following September.

### Night Owlets – After School wrap around care

We have introduced wraparound care for Nursery aged children; this will operate as an early years after school wraparound care facility from 3.15pm – 4.25pm for Nursery aged children, this session will also include Reception children for the first hour 3:25pm-4:25pm.

This new wrap around care is known as Night Owlets and will be based in the Littlefields Nursery building where the children will be able to access the early years resources and equipment.

### 2. Nursery Provision

In Nursery we offer one intake with the following 2 provisions:

- **15 Hours** comprised of five qualified teacher led mornings sessions
- **30 hours**  
**Government 30-hour childcare scheme** : for those parents who qualify for the 30-hour provision this will be comprised of the above five Nursery sessions with a qualified teacher and either five morning or afternoons with our Early Years professional team, this includes a free lunch club. To check your eligibility and for further information on 30-hours eligibility please check the Gov.uk website.

**Parents who do not qualify for the Government 30-hour childcare scheme** : for those parents who do not qualify for the government scheme we offer a paid for 30-hour provision this will be comprised of the above five Nursery sessions with a qualified teacher and either five morning or afternoons with our Early Years professional team, this includes a free lunch club. The cost of this provision is £75 per week and must be committed to for a whole term.

### 3. Oversubscription

If we receive more applications than places available for our Nursery, we will apply the following rules when allocating places:

**Rule 1: Children looked after and children who were previously looked after**, including those who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England, and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted or became subject to a child arrangement order<sup>1</sup> or a special guardianship order.

**Rule 2: Medical or Social** Children for whom it can be demonstrated that they have a particular medical or social need to go to the school. The SENCo in consultation with the Head will determine whether the evidence provided is sufficiently compelling to meet the requirements for this rule. The evidence must relate specifically to the school and must clearly demonstrate why it is the only school that can meet the child's needs.

**Rule 3: Staff:** Children of existing Fairfields staff

**Rule 4: Sibling:** Children who have a sibling on roll at the school or linked school at the time of application. This applies to reception through to Year 5.

**Rule 5: Distance:** Children who live nearest to the school.

These rules are applied in the order they are printed above. If more children qualify under a particular rule than there are places available, a tie break will be used by applying the next rule to those children.

#### 3.1 Tie Break

**Tie Break** When there is a need for a tie break where two different addresses are the same distance from a school, in the case of a block of flats for example, the lower door number will be deemed nearest as logically this will be on the ground floor and therefore closer. If there are two identical addresses of separate applicants, the tie break will be random. Every child entered onto the HCC admissions database has an individual random number assigned, between 1 and 1 million, against each preference school. When there is a need for a final tie break the random number is used to allocate the place, with the lowest number given priority.

### **3.2 Continuing Interest**

After places have been offered, Fairfields Primary School & Nursery will maintain a continuing interest (waiting) list. A child's position on a CI list will be determined by the admission criteria outlined above and a child's place on the list can change as other children join or leave it. The school will contact parents/carers if a vacancy becomes available and it can be offered to a child.

### **4. In-Year Admission**

We operate one main admission intake for Nursery aged children admitting all children in September, however, where space allows, we will accept children in-year who are born between the qualifying dates set out in section 1.

Parents should make sure they are aware of and comply with the notice requirements of the setting their child currently attends.

Rising 3 admissions will be allocated in the summer of 2026 before starting in January and April 2027.

### **5. Starting Nursery**

All children starting in our nursery will receive a home visit by our nursery staff. We stagger the start dates for new entrants to the nursery over the first few weeks of the term in order to help children settle and enable staff to get to know them.

Please note that in order to start at Nursery the following forms will need to be provided to the school office:

- The original Birth Certificate (this does not need to be retained just made available to view)
- Fairfields Primary School & Nursery Data Collection Form
- Early Years Sessions Application Form & Parent Declaration Form (including the child's NHS number) – Appendix A

### **How the information on this form will be used:**

By completing this form and signing the declaration you are agreeing for Fairfields Primary School & Nursery School, if they are oversubscribed, to check whether your child's details meet the school's published admission rules and if he/she can be offered a nursery place.

Any personal data collected will be treated as confidential under the principles of the Data Protection Act 1998. We will not use the data for any other purpose, nor will we share your data with any third parties other than the Department for Education (for statutory reporting), Hertfordshire County Council departments who may from time to time send you advice, guidance and information relating to changes to early years provision and educational services that are relevant and/or of benefit to your child, and your local children's centre who support the local authority by assisting families to access the services that children are entitled to.

### **Children who have been adopted from care or are subject to a special guardianship order or a child arrangements order.**

Eligibility will be based on your declaration that your child was formally a looked after child and on the evidence of their status e.g. a copy of the relevant order. This form and a copy of the relevant order should be seen by the school and they will confirm with Hertfordshire County Council that they have seen confirmation and enable a place to be offered under this criteria.
