This week we are looking at non-fiction texts. We will be looking at the ways in which non-fiction information is presented. We will be using commas in a list. We will be researching parts of plants that we can eat. We will be planning and writing a non-fiction text.

What can you do at home to help your child?

- ✓ Look closely at the spelling patterns and the sounds they make in weekly spellings given.
- ✓ Read non-fiction books or other texts with your child.
- ✓ Look at a range of fruit and vegetables.
- ✓ Talk about which parts of the fruit or vegetable we eat, how we eat them (raw, cooked, peeled/not peeled etc.)
- ✓ Find out about where foods come from.

Maths


