ENGLISH


This week, we will be looking at a unit on non-fiction texts. We will be focusing on non-chronological reports in the form of information texts in a documentary style. We will look at a variety of texts in this style, practising our comprehension skills and comparing the texts to see what features are included. We will pay particular attention to the use of subordinate clauses as this is an expectation in Year 4. Finally, we will research our own animal (linked to our computing work) to write our own non-chronological reports next week.

What can you do at home to help your child?

- Watch different documentaries with your child. Examples could be Planet Earth, Blue Planet as well as others. It may be worth watching these beforehand to check the content, as not all of it may be appropriate (animal fight scenes etc.).
- Read information books about various animals. Discuss how the information is set out and the language that is used (subheadings to split up the information, key terminology e.g. hibernation, nocturnal, carnivore).

Try to find at least 2 synonyms for each of your spelling words.	Write each of your words in dots. Next, join them up using a different colour. Create your own word search with your spellings. Show the answers to your puzzle in a different colour.	Write your words in fancy, fun or silly handwriting.	Write 2 words with one letter in common so that they cross over each other. E.g - d I o g t	Write questions with half of your spelling words. Then use the other half to answer the questions. Underline the words you used.
