English

This week in English, we will be finishing 'Letters from the Lighthouse' and will discuss the themes presented throughout the novel. We will then study poetry that uses tsunamis as a theme. We will be drawing mind maps to help us memorise a poem and answering comprehension questions. In grammar, we will be looking at the progressive tense.

What can you do at home to help your child?

- ✓ Look together at any complex vocabulary in your child's reading book. Discuss the meanings of unknown words.
- ✓ Look at how sentences are punctuated with full stops, commas, capital letters, question marks and exclamation marks. Discuss how they help with meaning and fluency when reading a text aloud.
